District Councillor Update

Why so many power cuts and should we expect better? We get power cuts pretty frequently in this ward, and in other rural parts of the district. I feel we should be getting a better service from our local network operator Scottish and Southern Electricity Networks (SSEN). Power cuts are at best a major inconvenience and for vulnerable groups they can be dangerous. Most central heating will not work when the electricity is out, no matter what the fuel is, and this is a particular risk for the old and young and those with health conditions. If you have any records of when recent power cuts have affected you, for example how many cuts there have been, when they were and how long they lasted, or the impacts they caused, please do drop me an email. This is something I am going to be following up with SSEN.

From West Hendred Parish Council The Crossing on the A417(Update)

Detailed design work has started including street lighting and traffic signals and a utility survey. The design has been adapted to avoid damage to the large chestnut tree near the crossing. A traffic management plan is being agreed to minimize disruption while the crossing is being built. A provisional

construction window of 4-8 weeks is planned early in 2025.

South East Strategic Reservoir Option (Sesro)

The Green Party Group of councillors on the Vale is very concerned about Thames Water's plans for a 1.5 million cubic metre reservoir in our area. This is one and a half times larger than the reservoir Thames Water consulted on in drawing up their draft Water Resource Management Plan last year. There are significant concerns about flooding risk, safety and biodiversity that remain unanswered, even though the plan for a large reservoir in this location is something Thames Water have been pushing for decades now. A recent briefing for councillors revealed that very recent groundwater modelling carried out on behalf of Thames Water shows a predicted increase in groundwater levels of 1m due to the reservoir at its southern side. It is concerning that this is only coming to light now as local residents have been asking about issues like this for years. As a result, Vale of White Horse Green Group is backing Group Against Reservoir Development's (GARD) call for a public inquiry into the reservoir plans. We have written to the Secretary of State to ask him to exercise his powers to call a public inquiry at this stage. For some reason the link in the newsletter pdf to the GARD (Group Against Reservoir Development) petition to Government to stop the reservoir going ahead doesn't work, all the other links are fine. The Secretary of State has overruled advice from his Environment Agency that Thames Water's plans for the Reservoir should be rejected because of concerns about the reservoir's resilience to drought and lack of proof that it represents best value for money. OCC, the Vale and Abingdon Town Council, alongside GARD, have all expressed strong opposition to Thames Water's latest consultation. If you would like to know more, both these links are helpful:

Holy Trinity West Hendred Oxford Historic Churches Ride and Stride – 14th September

The weather was warm, dry with a gentle breeze, and an excellent cycling temperature reaching about 20C. A really big difference to last year's 29C, with only a light wind! I opened Holy Trinity Church at about 9-15am, and then headed to East Hendred. A total of at least 9 visited the church, with a large contingent from Grove in late morning. Hilary Cakebread-Hall, of West Hanney who

is the Ride+Stride County Coordinator, said "In general we have been encouraged by the number of participants this year, although as has always been the case some churches inexplicably get more or less than previous years. We were very blessed with the weather which I think helped!"

The money raised will be divided equally between The Oxford Historic Churches Trust and Holy Trinity Church West Hendred. We usually receive our portion in late December or early January. OHCT have always been very supportive of us. Most recently, in February 2024 OHCT awarded a grant of £3,000 towards the new heating system, which was installed in May. We will shortly be applying to OHCT for a grant towards major work to re-tile the chancel roof. Thank you to all who have sponsored. Hugh Rees

We can therefore get into Wantage by turning R at W Lockinge roundabout, then L into the new housing estate and exiting through the bus gate and onwards to Wantage. Please note that this is only until the gas works are completed, scheduled for midnight on 27th, after which you'll get a hefty fine... It would have been helpful if they had adjusted the signage to reflect this temporary reprieve, but that hasn't happened.
